Pastoral Perspectives for April 2025

Grace and peace to you from God the Father of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit.

We are still in the midst of our Lenten journey which began on March 5th (Ash Wednesday), and we still have a long way to go. When we read the text, we see that Jesus fasted for 40 days and during time he was tempted by the devil. Yes, I confess that the devil is real, and I do so because the Holy Bible tells me so! Now, does the devil look like a horned pitchfork carrying tailed red character? I think not, he's much more cunning and able to camouflage himself. After all, he is the prince of lies.

Recently I have been researching the topic of grief. Grief is a normal reaction to pain and loss. But it sometimes can take over our whole lives leaving us so stricken by sorrow that we cannot even move. Martin Luther suffered greatly from periods of depression during his life. With the reformation in its infancy, religious wars being fought the devil delighted in all the division and chaos, he too had days where he just didn't want to get out of bed. Luther suggested that in our depression that "we take comfort in the Bible, socialize with others, avoid solitude, laugh and jest to mock the devil."

PhD Stephen Saunders' book *Martin Luther on Mental Health* Practical Advice for Christians Today illustrates just how advanced the reformer was on the topic! (ISBN: 9780758672049)

Many clergy agree that there is a four-step method that will help people that suffer from depression and these are the four steps take two hours a day to complete in today's world which echo Luther's ways.

1) Work out for 30 minutes. Go for a walk, bicycle, do arm curls with a can of soup! Whatever gets your heart pumping and your body moving is good for you all round after all the body in the temple.

- **2) Fix or clean something for 30 minutes.** Simply grab something that needs repairs, or clean something, a room, the fridge, your vehicle. As I am writing this, I just cleaned up my desk in the office and I feel better now that it is decluttered.
- **3) Pray for 30 minutes.** Prayer is our way we converse with God. You can do it anywhere and everywhere as long as you don't live in Scotland (mentioned in sermon on March 16th, 2025).

Prayer is critical to our relationship with God. If you wonder how to pray for 30 minutes pray for your family, pray for the church, pray for your pastor and Kimberly, pray for your friends, pray for yourself and speak to God daily for those in need both far and near. As our church vice president said to his coffee group "pray a little receive a little, pray a lot receive much from God!"

4) Do something for others for 30 minutes. In this way we can reach out to our family, our church, or our community and see how we can be of service to others in need. It could be cooking, baking or caring for someone. It could also be visiting shut ins at home, in the hospital, sending a card, writing a little note or even just a phone call makes a world of difference to someone because it shows that you are thinking of them!

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus, I pray these ideas might help us in our grief during the season of Lent and throughout our lives. We can always take comfort in Jesus Who is the healer of our every ill. Any type of loss is never easy, but I thank God for the time we are given with family, friends and our pets.

As we continue our Lent journey and reflect upon our lives and our relationship with God in prayer, fasting and honest reflection, it is good to remember what the first followers didn't see coming and that is the crucifixion, death and the Resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus the Christ Who on the cross and in Holy Week defeated sin, death and the devil to give us everlasting life!

All who regularly attend Sunday Services have noticed the beginning of our construction taking shape. Currently we are in the pointing phase, which should be winding down about mid April. Then, weather permitting, the new roof will be applied, these projects will help us seal out the water that has seeped in over time causing issues on the inside of the building. Once we have concluded with the roof, we will move onto phase 2.

We have also been busy with a redesign of our website. The redesign will allow us to accept online donations and will allow a smoother flow of information. The completed site should be up and running for us by April 1st.

Our loan process is moving forward. We are anticipating it working for us by April 1st. What we currently have is labeled a draw down loan. When work is being done, we ask for what we need, provide documentation to support the request and the money is then transferred to the company providing the work.

There are several irons in the fire relating to future projects. We hope to be able to share some exciting news on those fronts in our May update. With all the exciting things happening, it's a wonderful time to share this news with our friends and neighbors, perhaps they may want to stop by and give us a try.

1st Annual Corny 5k & 1 mile Run/Walk


