Pastoral Perspectives for May 2025

Grace and peace to you from God the Father of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit.

As I am recovering from my second knee replacement my thoughts and prayers are with you all at First Lutheran. Due to time constraints, I am writing this reflection early and we just had heavy storms roll through the night in Washington (causing intense pain in my bad knee).

The current book that the adult catechism class is working through has been hit-and-miss in its content. But, recently it has been a very good read and the Pastor has us, as Christians, called to serve our Lord Jesus in three different ways or acts that are actually twofold: and they are; fasting/abstaining, then praying/reading the Bible and finally almsgiving/acts of mercy.

The first is *fasting* in our lives with eating less and not abusing our bodies as the Bible verse in 1_{st} Cor. 6:19-20 reminds us to do but, the author also used fasting, as staying away from sin so *abstaining* from our sinful addictions which could range from food, gambling, drinking, drugs, pornography, sex, whatever sinful addiction pulls us away from the light of Christ and into the darkness of the evil one!

The second is *praying* to God which is our communication route to be in conversation with our Lord as we are reminded in Eph. 6:18-20. Praying as we awake, thankful prayers over our meals, prayers for others in need, for us in need, and prayers at the end of a long day. Prayer goes hand in hand with getting into the habit of *reading our Bible* daily in our lives and remaining in God's Word helps us to remain in relationship with the Triune God.

The third is *almsgiving* which means giving to those in need as in St. Matt 6:3-4 this act of charity is not to be praised nor are we to be patted on the back when we give to those in need. But do it without any credit from this world. Is money tight? No worries,

as *acts of mercy* can be done daily without it costing us anything from our from our wallets!

Calling someone up and seeing how they are doing, praying with someone you meet, opening up a door for them, a smile and saying "God bless your day" and "thank you for your kindness" all goes a long way!

Our readings throughout the season of Lent have reminded us all on Sundays and at the midweek Lenten services that we are called as Thomas a' Kempis wrote in his book "The Imitation of Christ" to do just that! Imitate Jesus in our lives with love, compassion and kindness to those in need. Martin Luther called Christians "to be little Christs in the world" in all we do and in all we say from morning until night in love and mercy.

When we focus daily more on Jesus and His holy Word (Bible); we can then better answer the questions that Pastor Powell asked us at the April 2nd Midweek Lenten service in his reflection of the Gospel of St. John 6:27-29. "What are we working for?" and "What do you do for a living?"

These questions need to be asked not in the secular context but in the sacred context of Christ and how are we bearing good fruit to the glory of God through these three acts we were offered by the author?

It's something we should sit down and talk about, because we would then be able to share and understand that it's not scary to pray for someone in need, or help someone in need, to trust in God to get is through a tough and lonely day. But we must make the effort as God gives us all the signs to do so all around us daily! We are reminded in hymn #513 "Listen, God is Calling" that beautiful Tanzanian traditional tune that invites us to follow our Lord Jesus and offer forgiveness, comfort and joy through His holy name, Jesus the Christ! Our Lord and Saviour.

I am looking forward to seeing you all soon.

1st Annual Corny 5k & 1 mile Run/Walk


