Pastoral Perspectives for June 2025

Grace and peace to you from God the Father of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit.

I am working ahead as I am preparing for my upcoming knee replacement. The reading and reflection from April 16th, 2025, Unfolding Glory was very profound (NALC Lenten and Easter Devotional). These are the readings and reflections I use for the midweek Advent and Lenten services and are available to all. I encourage you to seek them out.

The text on April 16th was from the Gospel of St. John 12:27-36 (ESV) and it focuses on Jesus' reaction as He makes His final journey towards the cross. Jesus demonstrates how we are to deal with challenges we encounter.

My current challenge will be my knee operation and recovery. It is unknown what the outcome will be and to what degree it will be successful. I know this does not compare, on any scale, to what Jesus went through; the challenge I face are the unanswered questions before me such as:

How long will I be out of service to the church?

How much pain will I have this time?

How long will it take for rehab and recovery?

Will it be successful?

While a knee replacement isn't something I look forward to neither do I enjoy the constant pain and loss of mobility I suffer daily. I leave it in God's hands and the hands of the people God has put in my life for the operation and recovery and trust in God through the whole journey.

But how we follow the actions of Jesus in the text allows us to look differently on the challenges we experience in life. The text gives us the answer when we read it: "Now is My soul troubled. And what shall I say? Father, save this hour? But for this purpose, I have come to this hour. Father glorify Your name." Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again."

In Pastor Keener's reflection he addresses how often we go to God with the wrong request! I'm in pain, Lord-fix it! I am stressed, Lord-fix it! I am struggling, Lord-fix it! I am afraid, Lord-fix it!

But Jesus, in His prayer, didn't ask God the Father to **fix it** but, rather Jesus asked His heavenly Father to **use it**, and His Son, **for His glory!**

Through this wonderful reflection on God's Holy Word (Jesus) we see a new way to handle difficulties in life whether they be physical, emotional, spiritual, financial, or relational difficulties: the kind of challenges and problems that won't disappear with a few weeks of therapy, new meds, or a self-help book!

Our feelings can become overwhelming. The pressures of life weigh us down and we may even feel like God isn't listening to our prayers. But He is!

God the Father gave His Son the answer that, when the soul and the heart is troubled, rather than asking God to **fix it** we should be asking God how He can use **it** to His glory, so that we can help others in their trials through Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour.

I pray that in some way my first knee replacement, which was filmed by WHS and included my interview as the first outpatient in Washington Hospital to have this procedure, may have helped others to make their decision about the trials of getting a knee replacement.

1st Annual Corny 5k & 1 mile Run/Walk


